

CARES ACT DISCLOSURE

1. On July 7, 2020 Michael's School of Hair Design & Esthetics Paul Mitchell Partner School signed and returned to the Department the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.
2. Michael's School of Hair Design & Esthetics Paul Mitchell Partner School received \$66,189 from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement [for] Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.
3. Michael's School of Hair Design & Esthetics Paul Mitchell Partner School has disbursed \$60,171.50 of Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.
4. 55 students of Michael's School of Hair Design & Esthetics Paul Mitchell Partner School are eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and thus eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.
5. At this time, 50 students of Michael's School of Hair Design & Esthetics Paul Mitchell Partner School have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.
6. Only students who are or could be eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended (HEA), may receive emergency financial aid grants. If a student has filed a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), then the student has demonstrated eligibility to participate in programs under Section 484 of the HEA. Students who have not filed a FAFSA but who are eligible to file a FAFSA also may receive emergency financial aid grants. The criteria to participate in programs under Section 484 of the HEA include but are not limited to the following:
 - a. U.S. citizenship or eligible noncitizen
 - b. A valid Social Security number
 - c. Registration with Selective Service (for males)
 - d. A high school diploma, GED, or completion of high school in an approved homeschool setting
 - e. Eligible students must have enrolled in a Title IV eligible program prior to March 17, 2020, and must still have been actively enrolled in the program as of September 22, 2020.
 - i. Students who took a Leave of Absence on or after March 17, 2020 are eligible, if the reason for the Leave was related to COVID-19. The School must document the specific reason for the leave of absence.
 - ii. Students who started in a Title IV eligible program after March 17, 2020 are not eligible
 - iii. Students who graduated or withdrew from their program prior to September 22, 2020 are not eligible.
 - f. Eligible students must be 18 years of age or older, or if younger, currently receiving Title IV assistance.

All students receive the same kit for their program. All students experienced the same disruption to their program due to Coronavirus – outside expenses such as electricity, data usage, and internet were increased for all students. For these reasons, the School has divided the HEERF grant funding evenly among all eligible students.

7. All students will be counseled by the Financial Aid Department as to why they are receiving this money when it is disbursed to them. Any questions regarding Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act should be directed to the Financial Aid Office.
